## 1 Selecting opacity

Opacity (transparency) shares many characteristics with color. However, limitations in terms of backends mean that it is not always possible to use a dedicated stack for tracking opacity. The best results when breaking pages are therefore likely to result using direct PDF output (pdfTEX, LuaTEX) or with recent versions of (x)dvipdfmx: these backends do offer the necessary support.

For users of PostScript-based routes, note that there are security restrictions which can prevent opacity being available in output. In particular, using Adobe Distiller, you will need to enable transparency in the (text-based) configuration: this is not selectable from the GUI.
