

ACM papers are designed to have two modes: print and screen. The first one is for printed journals and books. The second one is for the online version.

The print mode is strictly black and white. Here is an url: <http://www.acm.org>. Here is a citation [Herlihy 1993]. Here is a footnote¹.

In the screen mode the hyperlinks are colored. Here is an url: <http://www.acm.org>. Here is a citation [Herlihy 1993]. Here is a footnote².

We can change these colors. The identity guide at <http://identitystandards.acm.org/identitystandards.pdf> suggests the following colors for ACM publications: [ACM Blue](#), [ACM Yellow](#), [ACM Orange](#), [ACM Red](#), [ACM Light Blue](#), [ACM Green](#), [ACM Purple](#), [ACM Dark Blue](#).

We need to select colors for URLs, footnotes and citations. I'd suggest [ACM Dark Blue](#), [ACM Purple](#) and [ACM Green](#).
