Dataset

- The dataset used was from "Survival Analysis Techniques for Censored and Truncated Data".
- 2 It was a hypothetical study of the mortality experience of diabetics.
- 30 diabetics were followed till death or the end of the study.
- The subject's age at entry into the study and the age at the end of the study or death were recorded.
- Rather than time to event analysis, I was interested in how "entry age" and "exit age", affected survival.
- The response variable, survival, was binary (=1 if alive, =0 if dead).
- The dataset contained no missing data.
