

# The package **paresse**<sup>\*</sup>

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## Abstract

This package implements an example from T. LACHAND-ROBERT in [1]. It provides a means of typing isolated greek letters with the character § activated and redefined. Instead of `\(\alpha\)` one types `§a` to obtain  $\alpha$ .

**Important:** You have to load it **after** the `inputenc` package if the latter is used. Moreover the sign § must be a letter for **TEX**.

**New:** with this version 4, one can use this package even with utf8-encoded source for **LATEX**, **LuaLATEX**, or **XCLATEX**.

The English documentation for the final user of the package **paresse** is available in the file **paresse-en.pdf**.

## Résumé

Ce module, reprenant un exemple de T. LACHAND-ROBERT dans [1], fournit un moyen de taper des lettres grecques isolées à l'aide du caractère § actif et redéfini. Au lieu de `\(\alpha\)` ou tape §a pour obtenir  $\alpha$ .

**Important :** Il doit être chargé **après** `inputenc` si ce dernier est utilisé. De plus, il faut que le signe § soit une lettre pour **TEX**.

**Nouveau :** avec cette version 4, on peut utiliser cette extension même dans un source codé en utf-8 avec **LATEX**, **LuaLATEX** ou **XCLATEX**.

La documentation française pour l'utilisateur de l'extension **paresse** est disponible sous le nom de **paresse-fr.pdf**.

## 1 The code

## 1.1 The sty file

From the 4th version, I have used `skeyval` for it provides toggle-keys. But times are a-changing and so is `skeyval`. From this version 4.1, I use `skeyval-bc` which retains the old ways of `skeyval`. `skeyval-bc` loads `xkeyval` the macros of which I use to manage options.

`ifluatex` and `ifxetex` are required to take care of Lua<sup>L</sup>A<sub>T</sub>E<sub>X</sub> and X<sub>H</sub><sup>L</sup>A<sub>T</sub>E<sub>X</sub> respectively.

With \define@bitogkeys, from `skeyval-bc`, I define nine pairs of complementary toggle keys. If one of the pair is set to `true`, the other will be automatically set to `false` and vice-versa.

The prefix of the *secret* macros of this package is `GA@`. Here I define the macros which will print the correct character according to the chosen options. `\iftogon` is provided by `skeyval-bc`.

I test the engine, if it is X<sub>E</sub>T<sub>E</sub>X or LuaT<sub>E</sub>X, the file `paresseold.sto` is loaded.

We arrive here if the working engine is good old  $\text{\TeX}$  (in fact, good not so old  $\varepsilon\text{-}\text{\TeX}$  I hope for some things could depend on  $\varepsilon\text{-}\text{\TeX}$ -nical internals).

First some useful macros to take care of the encoding. The macros have been given to me by Christian TELLECHEA I do heartily thank for his kindness.

The first one takes care of problems of encoding.

The main action is then delayed at the beginning of the document for reasons already given above. In case the `utf8` encoding has been detected, the file `paresseutf8.sto` is loaded, otherwise it is `paresseold.sto` once again.

`\makeatletter` is needed to mimic the loading of a `sty` file for, at the beginning of the document, `@` is no more a letter. Naturally, we must revert `@` to its non-letter status at the end of the loading.

## 1.2 The file paresseold.sto

This file will be loaded in all cases except when the working engine is L<sup>A</sup>T<sub>E</sub>X with `[utf8]{inputenc}` loaded. `^a7` is T<sub>E</sub>Xnical code for the character I type, on my French keypad, with key §.

This is almost the content of the version 3 of `paresse.sty`. The changes are the use of toggles provided by `skeyval-bc` and the appearance of `$Z` to obtain §— which is always available through `\$1`.

### 1.3 The file `paresseutf8.sto`

This part is brand new. It deals with the document encoded in utf8 via `\usepackage[utf8]{fontenc}` and compiled with L<sup>A</sup>T<sub>E</sub>X.

It is at the request of Christian TELLECHEA that this package now deals with such source. Most of the macros of this part were created by the same Christian.

First a bit of identification

followed by code partially taken from `utf8.def` for I wanted to implement the option TAME and, to do so, needed to redeclare the character  $\$$ . Four macros are used in such a redeclaration and they are made unavailable outside preamble in `utf8.def`.

The original `\DeclareUnicodeCharacter` depends on `\parse@XML@charref` which itself depends on `\parse@UTFviii@a` and `\parse@UTFviii@b`. Those two last macros are defined in terms of accessible macros. Therefore, I first create an alias of the last two and then define `\declareunicodecharacter` and `\GA@parse@XML@charref` in terms of the *localised* version of `\parse@UTFviii@a` and `\parse@UTFviii@b`.

To be on the safe side, I repeat the invocations of catcode of `utf8.def`.

And now for the *working* code: when the paresse is active, the byte 00A7 is an alias for `\@paresse` and, because of the following, the code `\@paresse<token>` is changed into `\@i@paresse<token>` with the side effect that `\@toks` is let to `<token>`.

At that point, the code which was `\@paresse<token>` is either `\S<token>` or `\@ii@paresse` which awaits for an argument. That argument will be the still present `<token>`.
