 Boy.KLK tree.K up climb-ÖT.K  
 The boy climbed up a tree.
- (30) *assa kal dṣṣapur ni dṣṣana*  
 We tomorrow Jaipur not go.ĚŚ Ā  
 We will not go to Jaipur tomorrow.
